Devon County Council propose to make this under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 to

INTRODUCE A 20MPH LIMIT on **C128 Days-Pottles Lane, Exminster**, from its junction with Main Road to a point 46 metres west of the western boundary of No. 1 Stevens Cottages

### **Statement of Reasons**

It is proposed to change the existing 30mph speed limit on Days-Pottles Lane, Exminster to a 20mph speed limit. It is considered necessary to reduce the speed of traffic along Days-Pottles Lane due to an increase in vehicular traffic using Days-Pottles Lane from various new housing developments in the vicinity of Exminster and using the road as a rat-run. Lowering the speed limit will improve road safety for all road users in the area including pedestrians and cyclists. The 20mph speed limit has been requested by the Parish Council.

Specifically, the order if made will avoid danger to persons or other traffic using the road or any other road or for preventing the likelihood of any such danger arising and preserving or improving the amenities of the area through which the road runs.
