

**Devon County Council (Various Roads, Ipplepen, Marldon & Berry Pomeroy)
(Prohibition of Heavy Commercial Vehicles) Amendment Order**

Devon County Council make the following order in exercise of powers under sections 1, 2, 3, part IV of schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and of all other enabling powers

1. This order comes into force _____ and may be cited as “Devon County Council (Various Roads, Ipplepen, Marldon & Berry Pomeroy) (Prohibition of Heavy Commercial Vehicles) Amendment Order “
2. In this order
“goods vehicle” means a motor vehicle constructed or adapted for use for the carriage of goods or burden of any description, or a trailer so constructed or adapted
“heavy commercial vehicle” means any goods vehicle which has an operating weight exceeding 7.5 tonnes
“trailer” means any vehicle other than a motor vehicle
3. Save as provided in article 4, no heavy commercial vehicle shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a traffic warden, proceed in the lengths of roads specified in the schedules
4. Nothing in article 3 makes it unlawful for a heavy commercial vehicle to proceed in the lengths of roads specified in the schedules if the vehicle is being used
 - (a) for or in connection with the conveyance of goods to or from any premises situated on or adjacent to those lengths of roads
 - (b) for the purposes of agriculture on any land adjacent to those lengths of roads
 - (c) in connection with the carrying out on, or on premises situated on or adjacent to, those lengths of roads of any of the following reasons
 - (i) building, industrial or demolition operations
 - (ii) the removal of obstructions to traffic
 - (iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the road
 - (iv) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in, or in land adjacent to, the roads of any sewer, or any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of water, gas or electricity, or any electronic communications network as defined in section 32 of the Communications Act 2003
 - (d) in the service of a local authority or a water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties
 - (e) for fire, police or ambulance purposes
 - (f) to proceed to or from any premises which are situated on or adjacent to those lengths of roads and at which the vehicle is to be, or has been, garaged, serviced or repaired
5. Nothing in article 3 makes it unlawful for a heavy commercial vehicle to proceed in the length of road specified in schedule 2 if the vehicle is being used for or in connection with the conveyance of goods to or from any premises situated on or adjacent to Road from Bickley Mill Cross to Bulleigh Cross and Road from Maddacombe Cross to Bickley Mill Cross (locally known as Bickley Road)
6. The County of Devon (Various Roads in the Parishes of Marldon and Berry Pomeroy) (Prohibition of Heavy Commercial Vehicles) Order 2003 is revoked
